5.c. Stand for Education Rally

Why are the Alberta Teachers Association (ATA) and Alberta School Council Association (ASCA) hosting a provincial Rally?

Public education in Alberta is at a crossroads. The decisions being made by the current government will have a lasting impact on the educational experience of students, the ability of teachers to teach, and the capacity of our schools to meet the expectations of Albertans for its future citizens.

Now is the time to send a clear message to all political parties that they need to make concrete commitments to improving public education in their platforms.

The rally is only one event in a nine-month advocacy campaign in the lead-up to the May 2023 provincial election.

Why are the Alberta Teachers Association (ATA) and Alberta School Council Association (ASCA) hosting a provincial rally?

The rally unites teachers, parents and their allies as they stand together in support of a shared vision for public education that will have the support of most Albertans, regardless of their political affiliations. It focuses on what public education should and could look like in Alberta.

Over the past few years, the government has been making significant changes to public education. Here are some examples:

- the removal of "public" from school board names
- the new curriculum
- the reduction of funding to Alberta School Councils

It's happening on the same weekend as the the UCP and NDP hold major conventions or meetings to discuss platforms or policies.
