- Friends meeting last week reelected the Secretary position Carrie Slater
- Ski Night will be held in partnership with JJ Nearing, Bertha Kennedy, and Holy Family. Deposit has been paid. It is set for Mar 1 at Sunridge from 6 to 9pm
- This year it was suggested to us, so we are tracking hours. We hope it helps add an objective measure to each fundraiser for how much work goes into it. It will allow us to see the number of hours that goes into a fundraiser and compare that to how much money it makes. It will be nice to be able to report to the parents at Council how many volunteer hours are spent to raise the funds that we support the school with.
- As an example: So far, the Halloween Dance has been a collection of 23.5hrs of preparation. Tickets, emails, posters, advertising, shopping, decor, etc.
- Halloween Dance is Friday, and we will be running a 50/50 for one day only on Friday as well. It is open to everyone, will be sent out by email on Friday morning

- Art Cards are being done in classes now. This year we have optional paper to go home with students to complete their own art to be turned into a card. The paper can be requested from the teachers. All artworks will be due back Nov 5th to the school. All art will be turned into sample cards available for purchase.
